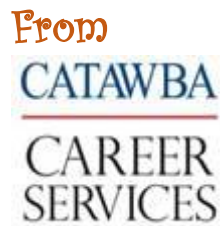

The Health Foundation works with a cross-sector collective impact initiative focused on three initiatives: expanding healthy eating and active living (HEAL), improving resiliency for survivors of adverse childhood

experiences, and improving access to health care. The VISTA will help to coordinate communications within this coalition and support community outreach efforts.

Social Media and Photography Whether it's the story of a child who goes back to school after becoming jigger free, the journey of shoe from start to finish, a profile of a staff member, storytelling is a critical part of what we do in Uganda. Studies Living jigger free is simple, at least on paper. If a person wears closed toed shoes, practices good hygiene, and removes any jiggers they happen to get early on, they will never be infested. However, there are many social, economic, and cultural reasons these steps can be difficult for people and communities to implement. Sole Hope works holistically with full time teams of educators, nurses, social workers, and shoemakers to address these issues. Program assessment is an increasingly important part of what we do. Contribute your skills to help as we measure what the most impactful parts of our programs are and look at where our efforts should be refined or redirected.

Early Childhood Education, English as a Second Language, Cross Cultural Education Education is a key part of Sole Hope's mission. Whether it's teaching kids how to live jigger free, teaching games at clinics, or helping students staying in our Outreach House stay up to speed with classes at school, we try to make every interaction educational. Adults at our Outreach House are also always learning about how to keep their families jigger free as well as receiving personalized learning about business, farming methods, weaving skills, etc... The Director of Student Ministries is responsible for designing, coordinating, and overseeing age appropriate ministries for children and teenagers with the goal of making disciples both in and beyond the walls of the church and helping students deepen their faith and daily relationship with Christ. Areas of focus include community building, worship, discipleship / study, mission and outreach. The Director of Student Ministries will serve as a spiritual leader and Biblical role model for students and their families and work to connect the students of all ages with the larger church and the world.

GENERAL EXPECTATIONS:

- Work in cooperation with the Pastor, Nurture Committee and other lay leaders to plan and conduct regular programming for children and teenagers that will assist them as they mature in their Christian faith and interpersonal relationships.
- Develop & lead regular, age appropriate and culturally relevant Bible Studies / Lessons to facilitate discipleship and Christian Education.
- Organize retreats, mission projects, worship opportunities and evangelistic endeavors.
- Recruit, equip, mentor and lead a team of volunteers as needed for projects and events.
- Remain current on methodology, curriculum and other relevant skills and issues related to youth and children's ministry through continuing education events and maintaining a connection with the District and Conference.
- Attend church functions where children and teenagers are involved.
- Attend Sunday worship regularly.
- Serve as an Ex Officio member of the Church Council.
- Produce a calendar of events for children and youth and communicate with the church secretary and pastor for appropriate and timely announcements to be made.
- Practice good stewardship with the Student Ministry budget, coordinate financial needs with the Church Treasurer / Finance Committee and Council, and organize fundraisers as needed for trips and events.
- Ensure that Safe Sanctuaries policies are followed for all children's and youth events.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE:

- Coordinate volunteers for our Community Vacation Bible School and participate, lead, or teach at VBS as needed
- Serve on the rotation for Children's Church and the Children's Altar time during weekly worship.
- Develop occasional Student Led Worship Services and help students and children engage with and contribute to congregational worship throughout the year.
- Teach / Lead a regular student worship / discipleship program, Bible Study, etc. (May be weekly or every other week)
- Organize mission and outreach opportunities for students including one Saturday in October at the Rowan Helping Ministries, an annual mission trip, etc.
- Coordinate Children's Activities & Events
 - Examples include: Easter Egg Hunt, Fall Festival, Summer Pool Party, Trip to the Rowan County Fair, Collection of Canned Goods for Super Bowl Sunday, etc.
- Coordinate Youth Activities and Events
 - Examples include: Summer Beach Trips, Winter Jam, Lock-ins, Putt- Putt, Dan Nicholas Park, Ice Skating, Laser Tag, Tubing, etc.
- Coordinate Fund-Raising Events
 - Examples include: Poor Man's Lunch, Mother's Day Program, Father's Day Program, etc.)
- Coordinate the volunteer schedule for Children's Church, Children's Altar, and Children's Sunday School to make sure all weeks are covered.
- Submit monthly expense reports
- Attend Council Meetings held every other month
- Serve on the Nurture Committee
- Serve on the Scholarship Committee

Internships-PR, Social Media, Event Planning, Literary Media, Marketing, Radio, Donor Relations

Alive Ministries: PROJECT PRAY is religious non-profit 501 (c) 3 organization with a 30 year history. We have recently relocated to northeast Charlotte. We have openings for a number of interns

The interns that might be attracted to our organization are those who might be considering some faith-based, church related, ministry career and want to work in a Christian context.

The focus areas that we could offer internship experiences include - a focus on audio media (podcast, etc.), social media (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, etc.), visual media (video), and print publications (book and study guide production). Of course, we would welcome interns who simply want experience in a professional office environment.

Internship Options – Alive Ministries: PROJECT PRAY

- Donor Relations: We use Donor Perfect. We attempt to recruit, and thank donors. We solicit additional donors and sponsors for events, working in both the personal and corporate sector. We also have a grant

specialist working with our organization, and, this year we won a small award from the Calvin Institute to assist with military families and their spiritual, relational health.

- **Event Planning/Coordination:** We work with churches and organizations to produce Schools of Prayer, Prayer training events, hosted by and sponsored by denominational offices and local churches. We prospect for conferences/events, contract and serve the sponsoring agency, including on-line registration, managing the details of remote conferences, some of which have multiple speakers, book tables, etc. High degree of personal interaction with detail management. We do 30 plus conferences annually.
- **Literary Media:** We produce three-five new books annually in-house. Alive Publications also considers publishing assistance for Christian authors and we receive a half-dozen or more submissions monthly for review. Experience in proofing, content assessment, design and layout (Adobe InDesign, etc.). We also produce companion study guides and PowerPoint teaching aids.
- **Marketing:** We market our conference services as well as books, DVD/CDs, study guides, separately and in packages. We do so by direct mail, telemarketing, social media, etc.
- **Media:** We produce videos and audio messaging. Video and audio suite. Recording. Editing. Produce video-audio training materials as companions to books and teaching guides.
- **Public Relations/Publicists:** We do not have someone who works in public relations, per se, but we are in need of such a person – even a student who is learning the trade.
- **Social Media:** Facebook live streams. Twitter feeds. Use of social media for promotion, teaching and training connections, information, advertising, etc. In January, each year, we produce a 21 Day National Virtual Prayer meeting with various ministries – via teleconferencing and Facebook live as well as video streaming.
- **WPRA:** We are in the process of creating an internet-based radio station dedicated to prayer and prayer resources – teaching, on-demand pod-casts, prayer events, experiences, discussions, etc. Updates on the global prayer movement.
