INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

The Waterworks Visual Arts Center is a nationally accredited non-collecting art museum by the American Association of Museums (AAM), one of twelve in the state of North Carolina. It was founded as the Rowan Art Guild in 1959. Today it celebrates its fifty- plus year history in its current location as the anchor organization for Historic Salisbury- Rowan County's East Square Cultural Arts District.

Waterworks is a main source of training for both the craft of making and the fundamentals of understanding visual arts. Waterworks provides diverse opportunities in the arts for all people through exhibitions, education, and outreach programs.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

At Waterworks, we help interns explore the areas of art and museum education. Our interns have the opportunity to help with art exhibitions, assist the Executive Director and other key staff, work with art classes, and much more. Waterworks encourages our interns to try a little bit of everything, but also to learn more about specific interests such as the Exhibitions, Education, and Outreach Programs, Publicity and Marketing, and/or Arts Administration and Business.

PAID INTERNSHIP: Summer ARTventures and Volunteer Coordinator

This internship exposes college students to projects and duties in all areas of the museum's summer education programs. Each summer Waterworks offers thirty plus studio art and clay classes for ages 4-18. Work is performed under the general supervision of the Education Coordinator.

The qualified student will intern throughout the summer months beginning mid-May through mid-August. A work schedule is mutually agreed upon based on need and availability with the Education Coordinator.

The education program is fundamentally tied to the Museum's exhibition and outreach programs. The student intern(s) work side-by-side with the Museum's professional staff in the implementation and flow of the summer studio classes and workshops and oversee the many student volunteers.

ATTRIBUTES

- Be a mature, well organized, self-starting individual who is energetic and dynamic;
- Arrive on time daily, in professional dress (business casual shirts/pants/shoes; shorts, skirts, or dresses should be fingertip length or longer; no jeans, t-shirts or beach-like flip flops)

- Work well with K-12 age students
- Have strong interpersonal and communication (verbal and writing) skills;
- Have an interest in, or experience with, one or more of: the making/handling of visual art, marketing and public relations, evaluation, and museums as a non-profit business entity;

- Have a willingness for some local travel (15 mile radius)



The Crosby Scholars Program is a non-profit organization that provides college access services to students in grades 6-12 in the Rowan-Salisbury school system. Serving more than 2200 students per year, the program is available to all students who submit an application by the published deadline. Scholars make a commitment to be good citizens in their school and community, to remain drug-free and to strive for academic excellence. Students must attend Crosby Scholar Academy, participate in community service, and uphold the terms of the Partnership agreement.

The Senior Advisor will have the primary responsibility of advising seniors on the college admission process. Some evening work may be required.

Responsibilities include:

- Attend Crosby Scholars Senior Advisor training on college admission process and portal use
- Advise students on the college search and application process including but not limited to target lists, admission requirements, and standardized testing
- Schedule and meet individually as often as needed with each assigned senior during the school day, to complete all conference notes; meet at school or in public settings
- Follow Crosby Scholars Volunteer guidelines
- Where possible, serve as an advocate for students in the college admissions and financial aid process
- Maintain and submit accurate notes summarizing each individual advisor meeting by given deadline
- Monitor your seniors' progress through the Crosby Scholars Senior Program requirements
- Have a working knowledge of the student financial aid process and attend one Crosby Senior Academy focused on the student financial aid process
- Attend senior advisor staff meetings as scheduled and the Senior Gala
- Follow up with each of your seniors who did not submit a Last Dollar Grant application
- Promote student retention in the Program
- Participate in the evaluation of the Senior Program
- Maintain confidentiality of student records
- Monitor student progress toward high school graduation
- Alert the Program Director or Executive Director of any special circumstances with a student that may prohibit high school graduation and/or college enrollment
- Collaborate with school counselors. Suggest additional community resources that may benefit your scholar; and
- Any other duties as assigned by the Program Director or Executive Director.

Qualifications-- Experience in school counseling or college admissions is desirable. The successful candidate will have the ability to take initiative and work independently with limited supervision. The candidate must be able to work effectively with a diverse population in a team effort to support the mission of the Program and must have a valid driver's license. POSITION INFORMATION:

The Arizona Game and Fish Department is seeking students to work during the summer to perform duties in the area of wildlife management. Students will perform duties under close supervision. Duties may include: collecting data, tracking, monitoring and counting animals, computer entry, developing educational materials, conducting creel surveys, fish sampling, habitat measurement, fish stocking, hiking, camping, swimming or working varied hours. Some positions may require a post-offer medical/physical exam and will be contingent upon successful completion and the agency's ability to reasonably accommodate any restrictions. Positions may require possession of and the ability to retain a current, valid state-issued driver's license appropriate to the assignment. Employees who drive on state business are subject to driver's license record checks, must maintain acceptable driving records and must complete any required driver training (see Arizona Administrative Code R2-10-207.12.) Tentative start date of the internships is May 18, 2015.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Currently enrolled in curriculum leading towards a bachelor's or higher-level degree on a substantially full-time basis (typically 12 semester hours) and pursuing a major in Wildlife Biology or closely related to the applicable internship opportunity (subject to verification)
- U.S. Citizen or proof of eligibility to work in the United States
- Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or above
- Ability to pass a physical exam (if applicable)
- Valid driver's license free of restrictions
