Email address and software	Catawba College provides all students with an @catawba.edu email address and 50GB of email storage accessed via Microsoft Outlook Web Access, active synch compatible smartphones, or Outlook on the PC.	Check your Catawba email often as it is an important official communication channel for the College. If you have another email address you check more frequently, use the 'Change Email Forward' link on the USER INFORMATION channel on the Home tab of CatLink to forward your Catawba email to this email address.
Virus and spyware protection software	All students are required to have current virus protection software if they are connecting to the network (wireless or wired), but the software is not provided by Catawba College. Microsoft Security Essentials is a good choice that is available free of charge to students.	

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Personal firewall software		IT recommends that <i>all students with Windows computers</i> turn on the Windows firewall.
Network-based file storage	All current students are allocated 100MB of personal storage space on the H: network drive. This network drive is backed up several times per week. Network drive space can be accessed from a personally-owned computer using an FTP client or by logging into the Novell network from any Catawba College computer. Additionally, 1 TB (terabyte) of web-based storage is available through the OneDrive for Business functionality of Catawba's email system which is hosted by Microsoft Office 365.	If the file is important, always keep a copy on another media (USB/CD/DVD) in addition to a copy on the network or web.
Backing up your PC hard drive		Regularly backup your hard drive files to another storage medium. Hard drives fail. Files get accidentally deleted. Operating systems can get so corrupted that the hard drive needs to be rebuilt. To recover, you must have a good backup of your files from which to restore.
Printing	<p>Students are not required to bring a printer to campus. There are Canon multi-function devices for printing, copying, and scanning in campus computer labs and all across campus. From their personal computing device or smartphone, students log into their Catawba email and send the document(s) they wish to print to email address print@catawba.edu. Logged into a campus computer in a lab, students may also send files to be printed from their H: drive, Catawba OneDrive, or from an external storage medium (e.g. USB thumb-drive).</p> <p>In all the above scenarios, the print documents go to the campus-wide print queue named <i>secureprint</i>. To release documents from the queue to print on any student-accessible Canon device on campus, students log into the Canon device by tapping their Catawba ONE Card OR by typing in their Catawba username and password, and select the document(s) they wish to print.</p> <p>Students are given \$45 of print/copy quota every semester and may check their quota in CatLink (My Account tab, QUOTAS channel). Students running low on quota may click the Add link next to their CatLink quota information to add funds. The charge is automatically posted to the student's Business Office account. Black and white print/copy costs \$0.10/page; color or 11 by 17 print/copy costs \$0.20/page; there is no charge for scanning;</p>	For convenience, resident students may elect to bring a personal printer to their dorm room. Be sure to connect the printer to your computer via USB cable. Wireless printers are NOT SUPPORTED on the campus wireless network.

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Internet Service Provider (ISP)	<p>Catawba College acts as your Internet Service Provider while on-campus provided that you are willing to conform to the Acceptable Usage Policy for Computing and Network Resources found at https://catnetconnect.catawba.edu/aup/, and provided that your personal computing device conforms to the requirements noted in this document.</p> <p>Catawba College provides five general-purpose fully-equipped computer labs on campus for students without access to their own computer, software, and/or internet access. Two are located on the main floor of the Corriher-Linn library, two are located on the third floor of Ketner Hall (322 and 340), and one is located on the second floor of the Hedrick Administration building (228). Ketner 322 is available to students 24 hours a day, seven days a week.</p>	<p>Off-campus you will need an Internet Service Provider (other than Catawba College) to connect to the internet.</p> <p>If you do not wish to conform to the requirements for connecting to the Catawba College network, or you have devices that cannot conform to these requirements, students can elect to purchase WIRED internet service from a local internet service provider. Do not purchase wireless connectivity from any internet service provider, as it will not be compatible with the wireless network already in place at Catawba College.</p> <p>Note that mobile hotspots are prohibited, as is installation of personal wireless access points/routers, due to interference with the campus wi-fi network.</p>
