### WEST SCHOLARS

\$5,000 scholarship (per academic year) for qualified candidates (merit-based), with an opportunity for one \$10,000 scholarship award (essay contest for qualified candidates). This scholarship also includes travel and professional development opportunities.



# DEGREES

## TRADITIONAL MAJORS

### **B.A. in Elementary Education, Special Education, or Double Major in ELED/SPED**

Prepares students for licensure in Elementary Education (K-6), Special Education: General Curriculum (K-12), or both. Provides students the flexibility to choose their licensure area while completing a major that delivers a competitive edge in the job market and equips students with skills to address the diversity of needs in today's classrooms.

### **B.A. in Middle School Education**

Prepares students to teach in middle school settings and to qualify for licensure in Middle School Education (6-9). Students select one or more concentration areas: Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, or Social Studies.

### **B.A.E. in Birth-Kindergarten Education (Evening Program)**

Prepares students to teach birth through kindergarten age children in early childhood preschool settings. Provides students the opportunity to qualify for licensure in Birth-Kindergarten or the flexibility to complete a non-licensure path.

## TRADITIONAL MINORS

### **Secondary Subjects (9-12)**

Offers students the opportunity to prepare for a future career in teaching or to expand employment options in their pursued academic major after graduation. Qualifies students for licensure in Secondary Education (9-12) in their chosen discipline: Comprehensive Science (Biology or Chemistry), Comprehensive Social Studies (History, Politics, or Sociology), Mathematics, or English (Literature).

### **Special Subjects (K-12)**

Links majors in Theatre (licensure in Theatre Education) and Music (concentration/ licensure in Music Education) with the opportunity to qualify for licensure in the chosen academic subject area, thereby increasing students' employment options after graduation.

## NON-TRADITIONAL

### **Educational Studies Minor**

Allows majors outside of the Secondary and Special Subjects minor areas listed above, such as Business, Computer Science, Exercise Science, and Spanish, to complete much of the coursework required for Residency Licensure (see below). Equips students with strategies and tools to begin a teaching career or to transfer to other related career fields.

### **Non-Licensure Pathway**

Allows students to complete any of the majors or minors listed above without completing requirements for teacher licensure. Provides students the course requirements needed to pursue alternative routes to teacher licensure or to simply acquire high-demand employment skills transferrable to many other careers.

### **Residency Licensure (Evening Program)**

Provides opportunity for professionals currently employed in a local school to complete requirements for teacher licensure.
