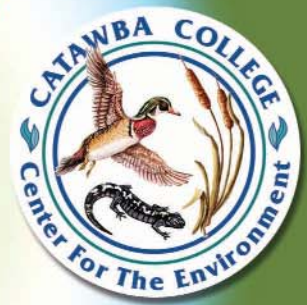

When is it?

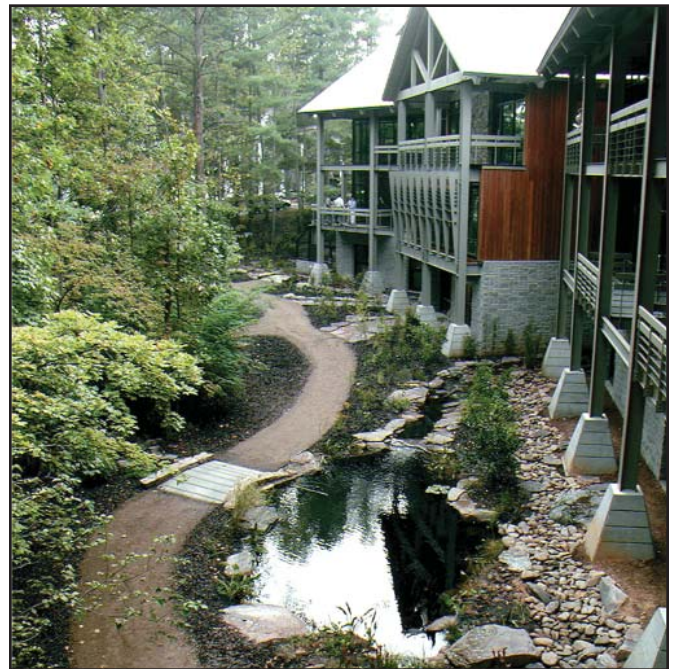
The five-day summit is being held **July 20-24, 2011** on the Catawba College Campus, with follow-up activities continuing through May 2012.

Who can attend?

The summit is open to rising high school juniors and seniors in the 2011-2012 academic year.

Where is it?

The Center for the Environment is located on the Catawba College campus in Salisbury, NC – just north of metropolitan Charlotte. Participants will be housed in Abernethy Village, a complex of five residence halls which are LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certified. These are not co-ed dorms. The majority of programming during the summit will occur on Catawba College's 189-acre ecological preserve and in the labs and classrooms of the Center for the Environment's green facility.
